

TYMPANIC TEMPERATURE MEASUREMENT

Tympanic Temperature Measurement



• Preparing for the procedure

- a. Perform hand hygiene.
- **b.** Introduce self and obtain verbal consent.
- **c.** Attach disposable probe cover and press firmly until probe cover engages.
- **d.** Ensure sufficient battery charge prior to patient use.
- e. Turn patient's head to one side and stabilise head.



2 Performing the procedure

- **a.** Pull pinna upward and backward. For paediatric assessment, pull pinna down and backward.
- **b.** Centre probe and gently advance into ear canal, ensuring a firm seal with probe directed towards tympanic membrane.
- **c.** Press and hold temperature button until temperature reading displays.
- d. Remove thermometer.
- e. Discard probe cover.
- f. Perform hand hygiene.



Documentation

- a. Document all relevant information.
- **b.** Report abnormal findings.

Background

Measurement of body temperature is commonly measured through use of a tympanic thermometer. Tympanic thermometers are commonly available in clinical settings and must be used according to manufacturer's instructions.

Equipment required

- Hand sanitiser
- Tympanic thermometer
- Disposable probe cover
